

Baby Showers

The Community Health Services team organized 14 baby showers throughout the year reaching 385 members. These showers had a dual purpose: to support expectant mothers with their care needs and to educate attendees about prenatal care, preterm delivery symptoms, postpartum visits, nutrition, and newborn care. Additionally, our community partners were on hand to share information about programs and services within their communities. These baby showers seamlessly blended traditional elements like gifts and games with the invaluable opportunity for education.

Post-Secondary Education and Training Scholarships

Peach State Health Plan understands that knowledge is key to being successful. More knowledge leads to greater opportunities for individuals to achieve better outcomes in healthcare and personal growth.

Each year, eligible Peach State Health Plan members have an opportunity to apply for a chance to receive a scholarship to support further education or work and vocational training post high school. Members are asked to submit a 500-word essay in response to a prompt. In 2023, students were asked to: Share your story. Choose a person in your life who has inspired or changed your life. Describe how this person has motivated you to apply for this scholarship.

Nine students' essays were selected by a panel of esteemed education leaders from throughout the state. Each student earned a \$10,000 scholarship from Peach State Health Plan to provide academic support and education resources and, most importantly, to address academic barriers within the education system.

New Mommy Store

Peach State Health Plan believes that a healthy pregnancy begins with excellent prenatal care, a smooth delivery and consistent, essential postpartum visits. That's why we designed our New Mommy Store to specifically help eligible members on every step of their pregnancy journey.

When members complete prenatal and postpartum visits, they can receive exclusive items like a new stroller, diapers, a reliable car seat, and so much more. Peach State Health Plan's support of new mothers extends to the breastfeeding journey. Through our partnership with Aeroflow Breast Pumps, eligible members can access a selection of top-quality breast pumps for free!

In 2023, we proudly assisted 108 new moms and provided 2,171 breast pumps to eligible members. We continue to encourage members to consider the benefits of breastfeeding by creating a rewarding experience for both mom and baby.

Healthy Adults

Peach State Health Plan knows the importance of extra benefits for our members, especially during the holiday season. In 2023, Peach State Health Plan approved more than 1,600 requests for our free Sam's Club membership VAB - providing families in need with access to critical supplies and resources. We saw an additional increase of 1,400+ inquiries for our adult VABs which include our Mom's Meals home-delivered meals program, gym memberships and hypoallergenic bedding to help eligible members with asthma.



Compassionate Support for Members in Times of Need

Meet Lawrence Latimer, a resilient 50-yearold Peach State Health Plan member facing unforeseen challenges.

While attending his 10-year-old son's footba game, he took a fall down an embankment, resulting in a fractured tibial plate and a significant injury to his left knee. Initial care, including surgery, set him on the path to recovery, but life took an unexpected turn when he was evicted while still admitted to the hospital.

Ensuring Continued Coverage

Redetermination

Medicaid redetermination is a crucial step in ensuring that our valued members maintain continuous access to health coverage. Traditionally, this is an annual process, but amid the challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic, the federal government extended support. Medicaid members, including Georgia Medicaid and PeachCare for Kids, have enjoyed uninterrupted coverage without the need for annual renewals for the past three years. Our commitment as a health plan is to ensure members



experience no gaps in their health coverage.

As of April 1, 2023, Georgia resumed the redetermination process for Medicaid and PeachCare for Kids members. Approximately 2.7 million Georgians were notified to participate by providing necessary information to determine their eligibility.

Empowering our Peach State Health Plan Medicaid and PeachCare for Kids members is our top priority. As part of Peach State Health Plan's ongoing commitment to member education, we organized events, such as Summer Block Parties at local Boys and Girls Clubs, specifically designed to empower and guide our members through the necessary steps to ensure their continued eligibility. Additionally, in November 2023, we co-sponsored the Gestational Diabetes Awareness Event led by the Georgia Department of Community Affairs (DCH) in Augusta.

Contributing to Georgia's Medicaid Re-Enrollment Drive

In collaboration with DeKalb County CEO Michael Thurmond, Peach State Health Plan played a pivotal role in a significant Medicaid redetermination event at the DeKalb Exchange Recreation Center in DeKalb County. With over 400 participants, the collective effort aimed to secure essential health insurance coverage for the community.

Peach State Health Plan actively engaged in the comprehensive review of Medicaid and PeachCare for Kids members' cases, addressing potential disenrollment challenges faced by residents in DeKalb and beyond.



Closing Gaps in Well Care Visits

Peach State Days

Peach State Days have proven effective in closing care gaps and improving member satisfaction. The goal is to encourage members with a noncompliant status to become compliant by addressing care gaps. Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnostic and Treatment (ESPDT) coordinators and Helping All Lives Through Outreach (HALO) teams collaborated with various provider offices across the state of Georgia to close Well Care Visit (WCV) gaps in care for members aged 3 to 20 years. This approach allows ESPDT coordinators and HALO teams to meet members where they are, address any questions they may have, and direct them to Social Drivers of Health (SDoH) services when needed.

During Peach State Days, members not only receive informative educational materials, but they are also eligible to receive incentive gift cards ranging from \$50 to \$100 following the completion of their visit.

In 2023, Peach State Days proved successful as Peach State Health Plan assisted 675 members in closing their WCV care gaps, resulting in \$45,400 in incentive gift card payouts.

Prioritizing **Behavioral Wellness**

Behavioral Health

Behavioral Health is an integrated model of care that strives to address the whole person and ensure our members have better qualityof-life and health outcomes. Behavioral Health includes services for mental health and substance abuse disorder. such as assessments, therapy, psychological testing, medication management and psychiatric care within an inpatient or outpatient setting.

Behavioral Health services aim to improve the quality of life, promote mental health, and reduce stigmas through interdisciplinary healthcare models and service providers as a systematic approach to providing patientcentered care. Improving access and quality to behavioral health services is foundational for optimizing health equity, reducing disparities, and enhancing coordination of care.

Peach State Health Plan, Pyx Health **Announced Partnership to Combat** Social Isolation, Loneliness and **Depression in Georgia Youth**

Peach State Health Plan announced a new partnership with Pyx Health, a healthcare technology company, in a new initiative to combat social isolation, loneliness and depression in young Georgians. With this launch, more than 305,000 Peach State Health Plan members ages 13 to 17 now have access to Pyx Health's interactive platform. With the help of evidenced-based screenings and support from trained young adults with shared life experience – called ANDYs (Authentic, Nurturing, Dependable and Your friend) - the teens are able to talk about loneliness and depression while being connected with critical resources to improve their overall health, resiliency and social supports.

Health and Resource Fairs

As part of our commitment to whole health, the Health and Resources Fairs also offered free health screenings. Peach State Health Plan members had the opportunity to take advantage of services including blood pressure checks, A1c screenings, vision tests, flu vaccines and COVID vaccines. This comprehensive approach reflects our dedication to the health and happiness of our members, reinforcing Peach State Health Plan's unwavering commitment to community care.

Block Parties

Peach State Health Plan, in collaboration with Boys & Girls Clubs, orchestrated six spectacular events to kick off the Summer Block Parties. These gatherings showcased a diverse range of community resources, captivating entertainment, food and swag bags. Our dedicated Community Relations representatives orchestrated these block parties across various regions.

Through these events, Peach State Health Plan made a positive impact on 289 members, with an impressive participation of 1,179 attendees. Members and non-members alike were enlightened about the invaluable benefits offered and resources available to them in their own neighborhoods. Additionally, we took the opportunity to announce the commencement of Georgia's redetermination period, which began on July 1, 2023.

This initiative not only celebrated the spirit of summer but also empowered our community with essential knowledge about healthcare and the upcoming redetermination period.



Peach State Cares

Peach State Health Plan kicked off the 2023 Peach State Cares season at Shamrock Gardens Apartment Homes in Atlanta. Pro Football Hall of Famer and Peach State Health Plan partner Champ Bailey supported the effort, greeting residents, signing footballs, taking photos, and even tossing the football with children in the community.

Connecting Rural Communities



Office of Rural Health

The Office of Rural Health's goals align with Peach State Health Plan's objectives to improve access to high-quality care in underserved areas and populations, develop strategic market-based partnerships and programs, and foster valuable relationships with key leadership in Georgia to align and leverage Centene's capabilities to support Georgia-specific opportunities and partnerships.

Peach State Health Plan and the Centene Foundation Announced \$2.2 Million Commitment to Georgia Southern University for Rural Healthcare Workforce Development Program

Peach State Health Plan (PSHP) and the Centene

Foundation have teamed up to support rural healthcare development at Georgia Southern University (GS). This collaboration aims to provide crucial education and training for healthcare professionals in underserved areas of rural Georgia.

With a joint commitment of \$2.2 million, the Centene Foundation (the philanthropic arm of Centene Corporation) and PSHP are championing the expansion of GS' workforce development program. This initiative will enhance existing programs for nursing, physician assistants, and addiction recovery specialists, ultimately addressing the healthcare needs of rural communities.

Peach State Health Plan announced a new partnership and \$150,000 donation to the Georgia Healthy Family Alliance (GHFA)

In 2023, Peach State Health Plan announced a new fiveyear partnership and \$150,000 donation to the Georgia Healthy Family Alliance (GHFA) for microgrants designed to help reduce healthcare disparities among uninsured and underinsured residents across Georgia.

The GHFA, the philanthropic arm of the Georgia Academy of Family Physicians and a networking member of the American Academy of Family Physicians Foundation, plays a pivotal role in addressing the healthcare needs of diverse communities throughout Georgia.

As part of this partnership, the GHFA will provide microgrants that range between \$1,000 and \$5,000 to Georgia Academy of Family Physicians member-identified special projects located across the state in both urban and rural communities.

The first round of microgrants was awarded in October 2023 to organizations such as the Project Breakthrough Homeless Assistance Project by Ujima Way, who supports crucial services for chronically homeless individuals in Clayton County. The funds will support clinic fees, emergency hotel vouchers, prescriptions, medical supplies and transportation services for health outreach.

Peach State Health Plan Announced Grant to Support Augusta University's Center for Rural **Telehealth Program**

Peach State Health Plan (PSHP) announced a groundbreaking partnership with Augusta University and the Medical College of Georgia's Center for a Rural Telehealth Program. As part of this collaboration, PSHP is contributing a generous \$15,000 grant to enhance the program's capabilities.

This grant will significantly expand the Center for Rural Telehealth Program, enabling it to offer Emergency Department (ED)-to-ED and Tele-Critical Care (inpatient) telemedicine services. The goal is to empower Georgia's rural hospitals by providing essential resources to keep more patients in their local communities, surrounded by their social support systems. Through this innovative program, we're making strides to increase in-patient volume and improve healthcare accessibility for rural residents.

At the Crisp County Community Council, a Georgia Family Connection Partnership, I am constantly seeking out reliable and efficient resources to support my community. Peach State Health Plan and the Medical College of Georgia at Augusta University Announced 2023 Peach State Scholars

In Summer 2023. Peach State Health Plan and the Medical College of Georgia at Augusta University proudly introduced the newest cohort of Peach State Scholars. These nine medical students were announced during an official pinning ceremony held at Augusta University.

The students are the third class of Peach State Scholars to participate in the Medical College of Georgia's 3+ (MCG3+) Primary Care Pathway Program, which was established in 2021 to focus on alleviating Georgia's physician shortage.

The scholarship fund and ongoing support for the MCG3+ Primary Care Pathway Program were made possible by a \$5.2 million donation from Peach State Health Plan in 2021. That year, Gov. Brian Kemp and the Georgia General Assembly matched Peach State Health Plan's initial commitment in funding to help kickstart the program.

In 2022, Gov. Kemp and the General Assembly added an additional \$8.7 million to the program, which was matched by the Medical College of Georgia Foundation.

Peach State Health Plan Donated \$1.1 Million to **Georgia Primary Care Association to Enhance Georgia's School-Based Health Centers**

In early 2023, Peach State Health Plan and the Centene Foundation announced a \$1.1 million donation to the Georgia Primary Care Association (GPCA) to expand operations of Georgia school-based health centers (SBHC).

"Peach State Health Plan is committed to providing all Georgians with access to affordable healthcare all across the state," said Wade Rakes, President and CEO of Peach State Health Plan. "School-based health centers in Georgia provide critical healthcare needs to underserved families who struggle to find access to quality, affordable healthcare for their children. This new partnership, along with the state's investments in Georgia's SBHC infrastructure will strengthen the capabilities and services these centers have available for Georgia's children and their families."

In September 2023, Peach State Health Plan and GPCA proudly awarded the first round of grants to







five Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHC). The recipients were recognized during the 2023 GPCA Annual Conference in Savannah, Georgia.

Peach State Health Plan and the Centene Foundation Announced a \$1.5 Million Commitment to City of Refuge, Supporting the Atlanta Campus Expansion

In support of Westside Atlanta-based nonprofit City of Refuge's efforts to expand services to residents of the area, Peach State Health Plan and parent company Centene Corporation contributed to the organization's Breaking Barriers, Building Momentum capitol campaign. The contributions will support the development of a new Transformation Center, which will feature additional housing, job training and economic support services. The neighborhoods nestled on Atlanta's Westside have felt the ongoing effects of systemic inequality in areas such as increased rates of poverty, crime coupled with a lack of access to affordable housing, healthcare, youth programs, and job opportunities.

Peach State Health Plan and the Centene Foundation announced a \$1.5 million commitment to City of Refuge, an Atlantabased nonprofit that brings light, hope and transformation to over 5,000 individuals annually. The investment Includes:

• Health and Wellness Center: This partnership seeks to build out a quality

health and wellness center at City of Refuge's forthcoming 36,000-square-foot Transformation Center. The Health and Wellness Center, which will include a 24/7 medical and mental health clinic, will serve survivors of trafficking and domestic violence.

 Workforce Innovation Hub: The Workforce Innovation Hub prepares unemployed and underemployed individuals to find meaningful employment. The commitment from Peach State Health Plan and the Centene Foundation will increase capacity at the Workforce Innovation Hub to provide more job training and readiness opportunities, including resume writing and interview assistance.

Part of our partnership with City of Refuge included employee volunteer opportunities each quarter. In 2023, Peach State Health Plan leaders and employees from various departments took time away from their desks to visit City of Refuge's main campus and provide volunteer support through daycare assistance, building furniture, painting and cleaning, and any other area where we were needed.

City of Refuge is honored to call Peach State Health Plan a partner, thanks to our shared vision of building brighter futures for the Atlanta community. Their commitment to our mission of providing light, hope and transformation to families in crisis has made a profound impact. Addressing Root Causes Social Drivers of Health (SDOH)



Peach State Health Plan's main goal is to understand what our communities need so we can provide the best support services to both our members and the areas in which they live. We work closely with social workers, certified community health workers and field outreach representatives to identify and address health disparities and socio-economic factors that affect the health and daily functions of each member under our care, improving overall health outcomes throughout Georgia.

- 1. Finding Ways to Help: We look for ways to make member's health better.
- 2. Connecting Members with Community Partners: We help members find people who can help when they need it.
- 3. Identifying Needs for Extra Support: We seek areas where additional assistance is required, fostering collaborative initiatives to bring people together.

Our Field Outreach Representatives Focus on:

- Planning for Healthy Babies: Offering informative and educational support to expectant members, guiding them from initial appointments through the postpartum journey.
- Connecting Members with the Community: Assisting members in locating essential resources within their local neighborhoods, so they have access to the support they need.

Our Social Workers Provide:

- **Telephonic Outreach:** Checking in with members via phone calls to offer assistance and support.
- Social Needs Assessments: Asking targeted questions to understand and address members' specific needs.

Our Community Health Services Include:

- Home Visits: Offering the option to visit members at their homes for personalized assistance.
- **Community Events:** Providing engaging activities right in a member's town.
- Environmental Assessments: Ensuring a member's home is safe and conducive to well-being.

In 2023, Peach State Health Plan utilized its centralized database to track and refer 6,537 members for Social Drivers of Health (SDOH) assistance. Additionally, 2,236 members received vital social service support. Our collaborative efforts extend to partnerships with 2,675 Georgia organizations dedicated to providing essential services and support to our members.

Georgia Pathways to Coverage Program

In July, Peach State Health Plan proudly introduced a new program called Georgia Pathways to Coverage[™], or Pathways, aimed at assisting low-income Georgians – those who may not otherwise meet the requirements for traditional Medicaid – in qualifying for Medicaid. The Member Engagement Team at Peach State Health Plan is wholeheartedly dedicated to ensuring that Georgia Pathways members receive the necessary support.

Since the program launched, Peach State Health Plan has successfully enrolled an impressive 1,235 members. The enrollment has surpassed initial forecasts and continues to climb reflecting positive feedback from our members.



At Peach State Health Plan, we actively engage with our members, offering various resources and support, including opportunities for continuing education, job readiness and volunteering. This ensures that members can fulfill the eligibility requirements of qualifying activity hours through referrals to community-based organizations. We are delighted to contribute to the well-being of our community through the success of the Pathways program.

Aunt Flow

Peach State Health Plan collaborated with Aunt Flow to address the pressing issue of Period Poverty in Georgia and across the nation. Dispensers were installed in schools across the state, ensuring at least one presence in each region. The collaboration involved co-branded dispensers and the provision of 44 cases for each product. Each case, comprising 500 pieces, was designed to supply sufficient products to support approximately 2,100 menstruators throughout a full year of programming. This initiative encompassed seven middle and high schools across Georgia, totaling 45 bathrooms.

Additionally, Peach State Health Plan introduced branded Period Poverty kits, carefully curated to include up to 10 pads, 10 liners, and 10 tampons, or 15 pads and 15 liners. These kits were distributed during school drives and mobile programs, reflecting our commitment to breaking down barriers and promoting menstrual health accessibility for all.

Helping Mamas

Peach State Health Plan worked closely with longtime community partner Helping Mamas in the effort to combat diaper shortages throughout Georgia and the nation. Support was provided through employee participation in a challenge focused on filling Helping Mamas' warehouse with crucial supplies for mothers and babies.

Peach State Health Plan also contributed over \$6,000 toward the initiative, which saw an overall total of \$16,000 raised and over 150,000 diapers collected.

Peach State Health Plan Supported Griffin Following Tornado Devastation

A series of tornadoes blew through parts of northern and central Georgia in mid-January, leading to a state of emergency declaration from Gov. Brian Kemp. The severe weather affected thousands, displacing families and damaging infrastructure.

Of the six counties impacted by the severe weather, Spalding County and the City of Griffin suffered great destruction. Businesses were leveled and homes were destroyed throughout the community.

Peach State Health Plan acted quickly, establishing a strategy to support affected communities mere hours after receiving news of the storms. Less than two days after the devastation, health plan employee volunteers donated 100 cases of bottled water – totaling 4,500 bottles – to City Church in Griffin. All volunteers received free Chick-Fil-A sandwiches on behalf of Peach State Health Plan.

The support of the community – and the state – ensured that thousands were warm, fed and cared for in their time of need. Peach State Health Plan is proud to have played a role in easing the burden of Griffin's residents as they began their journey toward recovery.

Disaster Relief Efforts in Valdosta

Peach State Health Plan joined the Salvation Army, United Way, and local food banks in Valdosta, Georgia, to bring relief to the community ravaged by tornadoes. During the drive-thru community event, 100 disaster relief bags were handed out to those in need. These bags were filled with lotion, hand soap, hand sanitizer, disinfectant wipes, combs, toothbrushes and toothpaste. Peach State Health Plan was able to contribute an additional 50 flashlights, 50 toothbrushes. 50 first aid kits, and 30 packs of diapers in various sizes for distribution. Our team members were able to connect with community members and Peach State Health Plan members alike, providing valuable healthcare information.

Peach State Health Plan Supports Georgia's New Parents and Growing Families Through Pamper Parties

Peach State Health Plan's Pamper Parties are dedicated to the distribution of essential items such as diapers and baby wipes while providing crucial information and services, making them a pillar of support for families in Georgia. Collaborating with various organizations, including the Department of Public Health, Goodwill, FQHCs and Head Start organizations, Peach State Health Plan has welcomed over 28 community agencies to these gatherings. These agencies offer valuable resources, such as baby formula, breast pumps, books, baby clothing, teething cookies and food boxes. Even bassinets have been raffled off during the events.

At the Pamper Parties, participants not only receive diapers and baby wipes but also gain access to car seat safety training, health screenings and other essential services. This collaborative endeavor ensures that families can access the necessary information and tools to provide children with the best possible start in life.

Recognizing the challenges faced by new parents, Peach State Health Plan places a high value on the importance of building a robust support system.
